Review: Today’s readings are the midway point in our Lenten journey, focusing on the relationship between God’s laws and the state of man’s heart. The First Reading begins with words many of us have heard frequently throughout our lives—the Ten Commandments. Before giving all of the Commandments, God proclaims to Moses, “I, the LORD, am your God, who brought you out of the land of Egypt, that place of slavery” (Exodus 20:2). The God of the Old Testament is the God of the New Testament: loving, merciful, steadfast, and forgiving, who seeks the happiness of man. The Father provides the Chosen People with the Ten Commandments to show man them to love God and neighbor properly, and cultivate a pure and holy heart. Above all, the Ten Commandments help guide us to our ultimate end: life with the Divine.. John’s Gospel recounts Jesus’s response to the Temple-goers who have failed to maintain a pure and holy place for God, both in the Temple and in their hearts. Christ makes quite the scene in the Temple area: making a whip, driving people out, and turning over tables. Rarely do we see Jesus act in such an aggressive manner. Yet his anger is not unjust. The Son of God responds to the failings of man, who have failed to love God and give him proper homage.

Featured study: Walk the Walk by Dr. Tim Gray

Reflection: One Jesus drives the money changers and those engaged in selling animals for sacrifice out of the Temple with much vehemence. As he drives them out, he refers to the Temple as his Father’s house. In the Gospel’s, Jesus’s entire life and ministry looks toward the Father. As Christians, we are called to honor the Father, too. The more we desire to honor our heavenly Father, the more we become like Christ. When Jesus taught us how to pray, he told us to begin by saying, “Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name.” The Father is the source of all blessings, and the greater our conformity to Christ, the greater will be our desire to love and honor the Father. Since we are adopted children of God, our primary duty is to honor the Father.

(At the beginning of Pope St. John Paul II’s encyclical Veritatis Splendor (The Splendor of the Truth), he wrote that the ultimate purpose of man is giving glory to God. “The Church, instructed by the Teacher’s words, believes that man... has the ultimate purpose of his life to live ‘for the praise of God’s glory,’ striving to make each of his actions reflect the splendor of that glory” (10). Therefore, zeal for honoring the Father should not be unique to Christ, but a common characteristic of all Christians.)

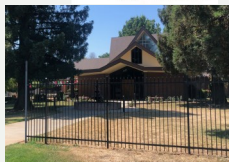

English baptisms are held every 1st Saturday of the month at 9:30 am. Pre-baptismal classes are held once a month on Sunday from 11:30am-2:30pm.

Bautizos:

Marriage:

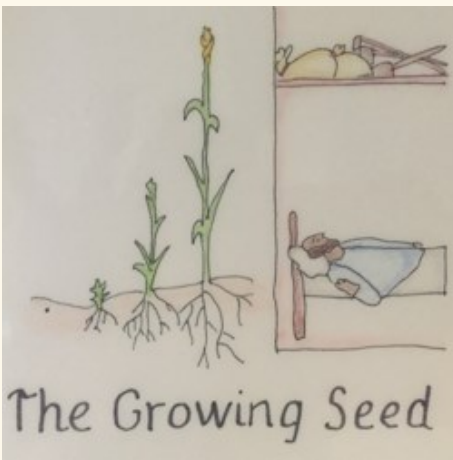

THE GROWING SEED

God takes care of us, waters us and gives us the strength to become good children of God. Lent is a time for praying more, almsgiving, sacrifice and being extra nice to all of the people around us. Lent is time to grow in love for God and neighbor. Hoping everyone is having a blessed 40 Days of Lent!

OCIA Adult Faith Formation

The Jews could only refer to G-d as Adonai or Elohim. Yahweh, the name of G-d given to Moses, could only be uttered once a year in the Holy of Holies by the High Priest. The disciples took note of Jesus' habit of finding a place where he could be alone to pray to God. What was He doing?

The disciples asked Jesus to teach them how to pray. Jesus demonstrated by starting with Our Father, actually Abba the Aramaic name a little child called his father - basically Daddy. Imagine what went through these Jewish disciples minds. Jesus was inviting them into an intimate relationship with His Father and brotherhood with Him. He invites us still.

This week we will be discussing The Lord's Prayer in our twenty-seventh session of OCIA, the process through which adults are received into full communion with the Church, on Sunday, 10th of March 2024.

Pope at Angelus: Journey through Lent listening to voice of God

On the first Sunday of Lent, Pope Francis took his cue from the Gospel of Mark that presents us with Jesus tempted in the desert (Mk 1:12-15). Speaking during the Angelus address, the Pope reflected on the symbolic significance of the wilderness, urging Christians to "enter the wilderness, that is, silence, the inner world, listening to the heart, in contact with the truth." In the desert, he continued, Christ "was with the wild beasts, and the angels ministered to Him. Wild beasts and angels were His company." But, in a symbolic sense, he explained, "they are our company too: indeed, when we enter the inner wildness, we can encounter wild beasts and angels there." ...Pope Francis concluded with two crucial questions: "What are the disordered passions, the 'wild beasts' that agitate in my heart?" And, "To permit the voice of God to speak to my heart and to preserve it in goodness, am I thinking of retreating a little into the 'wilderness', that is, of dedicating space to consider this?" "May the Holy Virgin," he prayed, "who kept the Word and did not let herself be touched by the temptations of the evil one, help us during this season of Lent."
